• Re-envision and constructed a strategic departmental plan that encompassed, inclusive dialogues, fiscally address deferred maintenance. Build a framework that provided faculty development opportunities and mentorship, collaboration with various disciplines across campus. Balance departmental budget, build relationships with the greater community. Construct and negotiate newly formed Artist in Residence. Travel abroad to begin, identify, or clarify the college's position on travel abroad opportunities for our students. Diversity the pool of competent, qualified applicants. Mentored Junior Faculty. Collaborated with colleagues on and off-campus to improve community relationships.

Key Accomplishments:

• In my first academic as chair, our department ended the academic year financially in the black; the first time the department had accomplished that goal in fifteen years; implemented a budget system that promoted person accountability.

In doing so, Emergent Design enables a team to "contrast traditional planning processes, and then invites in a cross-sector collaborations to collectively learn from their experience and adapt their strategies in real time." Ai systems, such as DALLE•E 2, "can create realistic images and art from a description in natural language." To investigate the impact of aforementioned Ai systems, the collaborators were challenged to list "framing questions." Some examples of "framing questions, is Ai intrinsically plagiaristic? Will Ai art be recognized as an art form? In what ways should people use Dalle-2? After receiving collaborators questions, one question is chosen, then the collaborators enter the Emergent Design process to investigate possibilities as a collective.

Studio work to investigate, record, communicate and memorize usages of material to construct a meaningful visual language. Present the creative process as accessible and simultaneously expose the intimate performative aspects of creating in a communal space

Duties and Responsibilities:

• Designed to investigate the basis techniques, and practices of digital imagining, as well as support students' conceptual development. The goals of this course, strengthen your ability to think critically and theoretical, heighten your ability to use various applications, build your research skills and develop ability to develop ideas. Provided students with cognitive and intuitive experiences, intrinsic and extrinsic experiences, and challenge students to digest the relationship between theory and practice, experimentation and failure.
